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REPORT ON THE STATE OF DANUBIUS UNIVERSITY OF GALATI IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021

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INTRODUCTION




Figure 1.1. Distribution by study cycles





Figure 1.2. Distribution by study cycles and forms of education










Figure 1.6. The evolution of the number of students at the College Danubius for the academic years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021




Figure 1.6. The Department for Teacher training academic year 2019-2020 vs. academic year 2020-2021

"Danubius" University of Galați organizes and runs the financial accounting according to the Accounting Law no. 82/1991 republished, with subsequent amendments and completions of OPFM 3103/2017 (Ordinance of the Public Finances Ministry) and Management Accounting according to OMFP no. 1826/2003 for approving the specifications regarding some measures regarding the organization of management accounting. Financial accounting ensures the chronological and systematic recording, processing, publication and storage of information regarding the financial position, financial performance and other information related to the activity carried out.

During the period presented in the report, "Danubius" University of Galați experienced an increasing evolution of revenues, in 2021 these revenues being higher both due to the increase in the number of students enrolled. The "Danubius" University of Galati is constantly diversifying, reorienting and innovating in new specializations in order to be able to face the competition and to attract students to new fields that are not covered in this region. During 2021, the University established and authorized two specializations, one specialization within the Faculty of Psychology and Biomedical Sciences, namely Social Work and a specialization in the Faculty of Communication and International Relations, namely Digital Media. These new specializations have led to new staff costs, material costs and authorization costs. In 2021, the University concludes the 7 projects financed from European non-reimbursable funds, in the filed of education and continues the projects on the coordination of environmental protection and the common reduction of marine waste in the Black Sea Basin, as a leader. Regarding the Erasmus + programs, they are still being carried out, to which are added 2 new programs KA131 2021.

The share of projects represents 23,92% of the total revenues of the financial year 2020. Payments related to staff costs accounted for most of the amounts paid in 2021 by the university (61,17%).

6. THE INSTITUTION STAFF AND THE SITUATION OF VACANCIES

At the beginning of the academic year, in October 2020, out of the total of 156 legally constituted teaching positions at the "Danubius" University of Galați, according to the job descriptions approved by the university senate, a number of 76 positions (49.03%) were filled with teaching staff with a basic norm in the university (of which: 11 professors - 14.47%, 24 associate Professor - 31.57%, 34 senior lecturers - 44.73%, 7 assistant professors - 9.23%. The number of posts for senior lecturers while for assistant professors is very low, and the pyramid of long-term teaching degrees is virtually uninsured.

Out of the total of 76 full-time teachers, 5 full-time teachers had already reached the age of 65, having maintained the quality of full-time by decision of the University Senate. 13 teachers were under the age of 41.

The didactic activity within the university was also supported by the associated teachers, in number of 34.

Out of the total number of full-time and associate teaching staff - 110, 102 teachers (92.72%) held the scientific title of doctor.

By comparison with the academic year 2019/2020 when there were 77 full-time teachers and 25 associate teachers (a total of 104 teachers) we can speak of an increase in the total number of teaching staff in the academic year 2020/2021, which is 110, of which 76 full-time teachers and 34 associate teachers, but unfortunately the number of full-time teachers has not increased.

All the holders of the discipline have the scientific title of doctor. All teachers meet the legal conditions for filling the positions from which they carry out teaching activities.

The teacher / student ratio in the academic year 2020/2021 was 27.08%.

In the 2020/2021 academic year, 13 vacant teaching positions were put up for competition, of which only 12 were filled: 4 associate Professor positions, 7 senior lecturer positions and 1 assistant professor position. No candidate was nominated for an assistant professor position. The number of vacant teaching positions put up for competition was higher than in the 2019/2020 academic year, when only 6 positions were put up for competition, of which only 5: 1 professor position, 1 associate professor position, 2 senior lecturer positions, 1 assistant professor position. A senior lecturer position was not filled, and the candidate was rejected.




Figure 6.1. The dynamics of the teaching staff in period 2016-2021

7. ENFORCEMENT OF UNIVERSITY ETHICS AND RESEARCH ACTIVITY ETHICS

The Commission for University Ethics performs its activity based on the legal provisions in force, as follows: Law of National Education no. 1/04.01.2011, Law no. 206/2004, concerning proper behavior in scientific research, technological development and innovation, with all subsequent changes and additions, Order of the Ministry of National Education no. 4783 of 30.08.2017, Order No. 3131/2018 of 30 January 2018. The University has a Code of Ethics and Integrity approved by the University Senate, no.1001/R/11.05.2011, changed and reviewed by the Senate Decision no. 215/06.12.2018, no.732/R/28.11.2018), Danubius University of Galați Charter and according to its own regulation "Regulation for the organization and functioning of the commission for university ethics", transposed in "ISO" format (reviewed / approved by the legal representative, code RG-46/06.12.2018, approved by Senate Decision no. 216/06.12.2018.) which includes provisions concerning acting on own initiative/complaints in the case of irregularities of intolerance or discrimination towards the staff (academic, auxiliary academic, administrative and technical) and the students/ Master students or in other cases.

According to the action plan for the 2020-2021 university year, approved by the University Senate, as in previous years, the activity of promoting best practices in the university took place through meetings with freshmen students of all bachelor programs, in order to present the provisions of the Code of Ethics and University Deontology in cooperation with Students' League. Debates have been organized on the topic of plagiarism in bachelor papers/dissertations with senior students of the School of Economic Sciences, of bachelor and Master programs of the Law School/Communication and International Relations. Meetings have been organized on the topic of plagiarism in bachelor papers/dissertations with senior students of the Law School/Communication and International Relations, enrolled in bachelor and master programs. Students are oriented towards creative learning, through stimulating assessment of the originality of projects and theoretical and applicative studies made by them, after accumulating information, also using the opportunities offered by Danubius Online portal.

To avoid plagiarism, including self-plagiarism, the obligation of checking papers published in journals, courses and volumes was imposed by using the anti-plagiarism software. Each candidate in the bachelor or Master exam fills in a statement taking full responsibility concerning the scientific accuracy of the paper. The coordinating professors verify each paper with the same anti-plagiarism software – TURNITIN, service contract no. B3384ECB-BD67-489E-BC06-DD1C2C0FC3EE/18.12.2020, for determining plagiarism, which is used both by the university publishing house, as well as by the teaching staff in assessing papers/projects, with the purpose of solving, besides a practical and education aspects, an ethical one. This program has the role of identifying and rejecting papers that are not in accordance with imposed standards. At the same time, a CD accompanies papers in order to store the content in a data basis to avoid trafficking of graduation papers. Danubius University Galati implemented the Order no. 3131/2018 of 30 January 2018, concerning the inclusion in all study plans, for university programs organized in higher education institutions in the national education system of courses of ethics and academic integrity.

During 2020-2021 university year, the Commission for Ethics of DU continued its activity of preventing potential plagiarism cases for the two categories of papers: bachelor and dissertation. Students/master students were informed about the legal consequences of such actions and the process of implementing

thesis verification software continued. At this moment, all students/master students are obliged to sign a statement concerning the originality of their papers. This proactive measure paid off, since it emphasizes the importance of the originality of submitted papers in different stages of their studies.

In addition, it continued to adopt a prevention policy regarding the potential breach of the code of ethics and academic integrity from the plagiarism perspective. It created posters and flyers with the topic "Plagiarism dishonors you", displayed and distributed in each School of the university and electronically displayed on the intranet. Elaboration of a "Summary of the Code of University Ethics" in order to display it electronically on the intranet and in print form in the School's bulletin boards. During the 2020 -2021 university year, the activity of the Commission for Ethics of DU was focused on promoting and ensuring an atmosphere of training and development in the university, in compliance with university norms of conduct, that prevent irregularities and breach of ethical norms.

According to the action plan for the 2020-2021 university year, the following have been accomplished:

- Annual report regarding the measures taken and the activities performed in the previous university year, 2019-2020, and its assuming by the members of the Commission, its presentation and approval in the Senate meeting in October 2020, in Danubius University of Galați, Senate Decision No.287/23.10.2020.
- Creation of a distinct section of the scientific communication session for students and teaching staff, called: "Ethics and Academic Integrity" included in the program of the EIRP 2021 Conference, in the section dedicated to students and Master students, thus, the action plan of the Commission for Ethics became achievable as well as the mission to promote these values among students.
- The campaign "How do we document on the Internet?"- creation of leaflets about how to document on the Internet, by teaching staff and students, in order to elaborate a scientific paper/a scientific project, to present methods and techniques of documenting, quality Internet resources, compliance with ethical and academic integrity norms (plagiarism/self-plagiarism) etc.
- ♣ Involvement of the Association Danubius Students' League in actions to prevent irregularities and breaches of ethical norms from the perspective of complying with the principles and provisions of the Code of University Ethics in DU.

Also, taking into consideration the invitation no. 104/05.05.2021- The Ethics and University Management Council, for the representatives in university ethics commissions, we took part, on Wednesday, **2 June 2021**, **Bucharest** (through an online platform) in a national debate regarding the Reference Code of Ethics and University Deontology, framework for university ethics codes. The event included a round table with the main institutional actors in higher education.

In CEMU, we are working, right now, at elaborating the Reference Code of Ethics and University Deontology, mentioned at art. 218 par. (2) let. d) of the Education Law no. 1/2011. The activities are organized with the support of UEFISCDI, benefiting from financing in the project "Quality in higher education: internationalization and data basis for the development of Romanian education", in partnership with the Ministry of Education.

Not lastly, the reunion in the special workshop for presidents of commissions for university ethics and of legal counselors in universities, in the presence of representatives of CEMU and CNECSTDI, to identify necessary solutions for harmonizing the national legal framework in the field.

During 3-5 June 2021 Braşov, Romania participation in the debate (through an online platform) The International Scientific "Ethical values in nowadays society – New challenges and trends" (VESA) organized in the project "Quality in higher education: internationalization and data basis for the development of Romanian education" (POCU-INTL), implemented by UEFISCDI in partnership with the Ministry of Education, project in which we were invited to be part of the target group.

Organizers of the conference aimed that the debates and the research regarding ethics, especially academic ethics, in the context of new challenges generated by the pandemics and of the new trends in the field, combined in an inter discipline approach, facilitate the best practices inter institutional exchange between participants.

The commission for ethics convenes at each beginning and end of the university year, initially to elaborate the action plan, and, in the end, for an analysis of activities, responsibilities and potential irregularities, moment in which an activity report is drafted generally aiming to comply with fundamental rights, with the principle of equality of opportunity, cases of intolerance and discrimination towards the staff and students, cases presented by the university community (including students/master students) that have been analyzed and solved. Each year, action plans, activity reports are presented and voted by the members of CEU (Commission for University Ethics), sent to the university Senate and to the Rector in accordance with the provisions of the Regulation for the organization and functioning of the Commission for University Ethics. The results of evaluations are included in annual activity reports, published on the web page of the institution and forwarded to the Quality Assurance Department. These refer to the situation of complying with university ethics and professional deontology and of good conduct in the activity of scientific activity, technological development and innovation in DU.

In Danubius University of Galati, during the 2020-2021 university year, we were not confronted with particular behaviors, incompatible with the norms of the ethical code, which leads us to believe that the members of the Commission for Ethics and Professional Deontology of DU have fulfilled their duties in due time and with professionalism, in accordance with the Regulation and the Code of Ethics.

8. THE PROFESSIONAL INSERTION OF GRADUATES FROM THE PREVIOUS GRADUATING CLASSES

"Danubius" University of Galati community of graduates is more than 23400 graduates of undergraduate, master, college or postgraduate studies, whose degree of professional insertion on the labor market and educational path are supported and monitored by the university by all possible means.

The report on the insertion of Danubius University graduates on the labor market was made using internal procedures, combining data collected by using the following attached forms: Register of employed Bachelor's degree graduates (code: PO-39-F5), Register of employed Master's graduates (code: RG-39-F8), Nominal list for issuing the graduation certificate (code: PO-55-F1), Declaration of employed Bachelor's degree graduates (code: PO-55-F2), Declaration of employed Master graduates (code: PO-55 -F2), as well as by contacting graduates on phone number.
